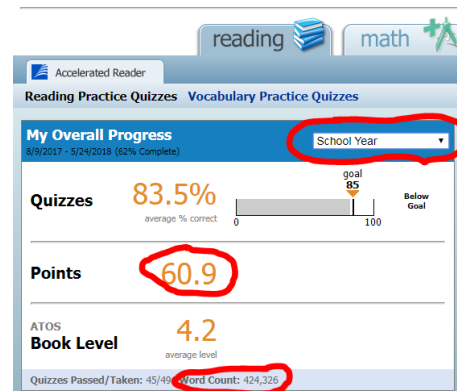

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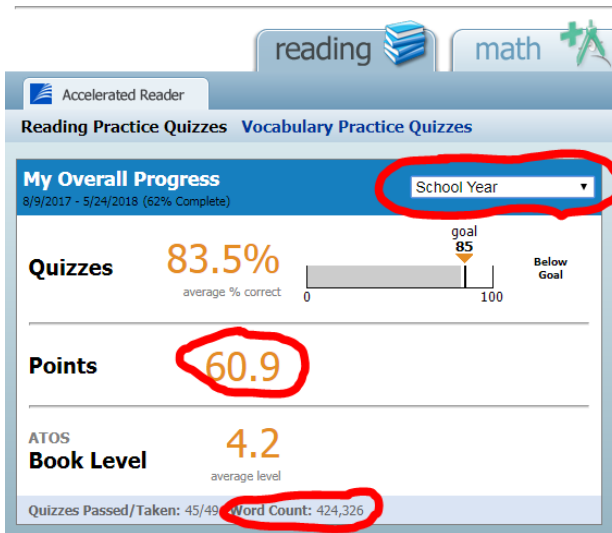
# Battle of the Books

This year, students will be encouraged to read from a list of books called the Louisiana Young Readers' Choice nominees. These are books recommended by the Louisiana State Library. Reading these books is **OPTIONAL** and parents should help their children pick out the titles that are the best fit for their own kids. Common Sense Media and Goodreads are two excellent websites to find reviews of these books. The titles are geared for middle grade students in grades 4-8. Students who read and test on these books should be sure to add these to their 40 Book Challenge log and use these points towards their AR goals. Check out the Battle of the Books link on the library's website for more information on each book. (lomlibrary.org)

- Read **THREE** of the titles:
  - **Election Day:** Students who read/test on at least **THREE** of the titles by January 9<sup>th</sup> will be allowed to vote for their favorite book on a real voting machine in the spring. Date TBA.
- Read **FIVE** of the titles:
  - **Battle of the Books:** Students who read at least **FIVE** of the titles by March 8<sup>th</sup> will be allowed to join a team for the Battle of the Books (BOB). Students will compete on teams against each other school-wide. The winning team from LOM will compete against other area schools in a tournament.
  - **Breakfast Club:** Students who read at least **FIVE** of these titles by the last AR deadline will be given a breakfast party and an award at Awards Day.

# Millionaires Club

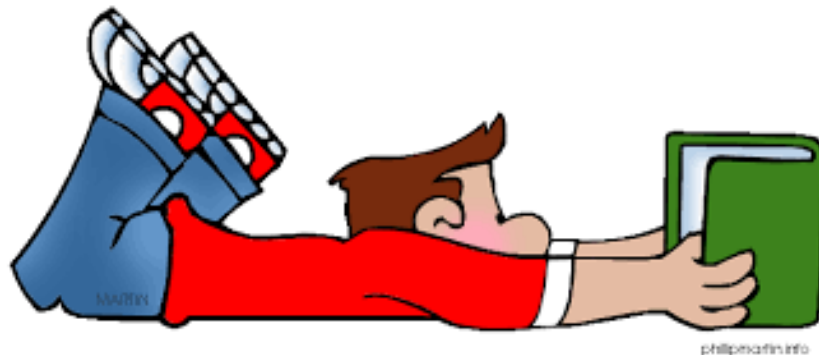

Read 40 books this year and receive a t-shirt and award at Awards Day. BUT, you must read a certain number of books in each genre. Example: 4 realistic fiction, 2 poetry, etc. As long as you pass the test, you can have your teacher initial your log. You have until the last AR deadline!



# Book Genres for 40 Book Challenge

- **Poetry**--Verse and rhythmic writing with imagery that creates emotional responses.
- **Mystery**--Fiction dealing with the solution of a crime or the unraveling of secrets.
- **Biography/Autobiography/Memoir**--Narrative about a person's life; a true story about a real person.
- **Historical Fiction**--Story with fictional characters and events in a historical setting.
- **Science Fiction**--Story based on impact of actual, imagined, or potential science, usually set in the future or on other planets.
- **Fantasy**--Fiction with strange or other worldly settings or characters; fiction which invites suspension of reality.
- **Nonfiction**--Literature dealing with an actual, real-life subject.
- **Realistic Fiction**--Story that can actually happen and is true to life.
- **Action/Adventure**--An adventure that takes the characters on a personal journey or to different geographical locations
- **Traditional Literature (any of the following):**
  - **Fable**--Narration demonstrating a useful truth, especially in which animals speak as humans; legendary, supernatural tale.
  - **Folklore**--The songs, stories, myths, and proverbs of a people or "folk" as handed down by word of mouth.
  - **Mythology**--Legend or traditional narrative, often based in part on historical events, that reveals human behavior and natural phenomena by its symbolism; often pertaining to the actions of the gods.
  - **Legend**--Story, sometimes of a national or folk hero, which has a basis in fact but also includes imaginative material.
- **Graphic Novels**—technically a format, and not a genre. These books are in a comic-book style with graphics and illustrations. Graphic novels can be made of ANY genre.
